

2. Where can we learn about God and how we should live our lives?

- 1. The Bible
- 2. A fun way to remember that The Bible is here to help us live a good life according to God's Will is to think of the word "Bible" as an acronym: **B**asic Instructions **B**efore Leaving Earth.
- 3. If we want examples of what it looks like to live a life of faith according to God's Word in the Bible, we can look to the saints, ordinary people who did extraordinary things. Check out the Pastoral Centre for stories on the saints to be inspired.

3. Name 4 ways we can help those around us who are in need.

- 1. Donate food to the Food Bank, raise money for a charity or people in need, donate clothing that no longer fits to centres like Habitat for Humanity or the Marian Centre, volunteer at The Mustard Seed Church or Marian Centre, acknowledge people who are on the street with a smile or "Hello," listen to someone who needs your attention, comfort the sad
