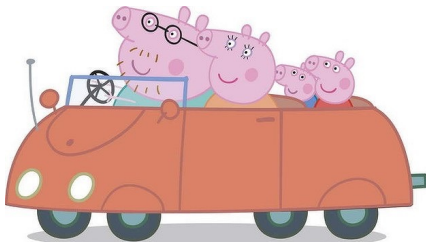

Parents' Cheat Sheet - Car Qs

Oct. 8/17, Jesus as the “Fisher of Men” (18th Sunday after Pentecost)

1. Whom did Jesus first call to follow Him?
 1. Fishermen: Simon (Peter), his brother Andrew, and James and John, the sons of Zebedee (Matthew 4:18-22; Mark 1:16-20; Luke 5:1-11)
 2. Another point we can make is that Jesus looked at regular people to spread His message to the world; He didn't go to the religious leaders of the day. Therefore, all of us are called to spread Jesus' message; it's not just up to the priests and religious to do that
2. What does it mean to be “fishers of men”?
 1. To be a “fisher of men” means to be an evangelist, someone who spreads the Word of God to those around him/her.
3. Name 3 ways to help your family and friends to follow Jesus.
 1. Some examples we discussed in class: Tell people about Jesus, tell people Jesus is God with the Father and Holy Spirit, encourage others to come to Church and read the Bible, invite your friends to church events like the Family Dance at the end of the month.
 2. In *The Orthodox Study Bible*, the commentator writes this note on Luke 5:6: “The Lord draws people to Himself by things that are familiar to them. As He drew the Magi with a star (Mt 2:2), as He would draw tax collectors by a tax collector (5:29), here He draws the fishermen with **fish** (see 1Co 9:19-23)” (p.1372). People respond to things that are familiar to them. If you get to know the people around you, you will better know how to present the Word of God to them so that they can more easily understand and want to learn more.
